9 A.M. – JOHN RIDGWAY: THE MAN AND HIS WHITE IRONSTONE PRODUCTS BY ADELE ARMBRUSTER.

This presentation provides an overview of the Ridgway family and focuses on John Ridgway and Cauldon Place Works in particular. His Class 4 earthenware registrations and actual ironstone shape production of the 1840s and 1850s will be studied. THOSE SKILLED WORKERS MAKING IRONSTONE **JEAN-PIERRE DION AND JACQUELINE BEAUDRY DION.** Learn about the process of manufacturing ironstone in the 19th century and the wide array of workers with different skill sets who made it possible. The Help Wanted sections regularly newspapers contained advertisements for more than a dozen types of skilled positions. This presentation will identify the contribution of each of these positions. Special emphasis will be placed on mold making, its usage and its commercial value. This presentation is based on 19th century technical

publications focused on the production of ceramics plus informative descriptions by 19th century visitors to several production sites in Great Britain, the United States, and Canada.

* ABOUT THE AUCTION. New in 2024 is the Box Lot Auction which, for consignors and donors, is an alternative to WICA's Saturday evening Catalog Auction. WICA members may consign or donate to either or both auctions. WICA will accept up to 100 box lots for the Box Lot Auction. To participate WICA members should indicate their intention on the Convention Registration Form and identify the number of 15" x 12" x 1 3/4"

corrugated cardboard trays required. Consignors will pay a non-refundable fee of \$5 for each tray reserved; donors will not pay a fee. Up to ten trays may be reserved by one consignor/donor. Items must fit comfortably on the tray; no overflow will be permitted. Unlike the Catalog Auction, the Box Lot Auction does not offer a reserve selling price option. Box Lot Auction Guidelines and Conditions are outlined on page 9.

* THE ADVANTAGES FOR A MEMBER TO CONSIGN OR DONATE TO THE BOX LOT AUCTION ARE:

- No photos, descriptions, condition reports or auction consignment/donation forms are required.
- Items which are more common and those which may not be suitable for the Catalog Auction qualify for the Box Lot Auction.
- Researching to identify items is unnecessary.
- The final decision regarding items to be included in a box lot can be made when packing for the convention.

❖ THE CONSIGNMENT FEE SCHEDULE IS AS FOLLOWS:

- WICA will not retain a consignment fee for box lots which sell for \$50 or less.
- For box lots which sell for more than \$50,
 WICA will retain a consignment fee of 10% for any amount over \$50.
- Lots will be sold to the highest bidder at the auction.
- Consignors will be paid within four weeks from the date of the auction.

- Bring boxes and packing materials for any lots you purchase. WICA will not provide a packing and shipping service.
- Pay by cash or check and pack up and remove the box lots you acquire prior to the 4:30 p.m. Social Hour. WICA will not accept credit cards.

4:30 р.м. - CATALOG AUCTION PREVIEW AND SOCIAL HOUR. A tradition with WICA is the Saturday evening Catalog Auction. The preview is the time to inspect white ironstone items which have been consigned or donated to see which ones you would like to bid on and take home. The Catalog Auction Consignment/Donation Agreement Form is included with this package and is due to Denise Schine by March 1, 2024. WICA will accept up to 100 lots of white ironstone items to this auction; lots may include one or more quality items.

Members who consign or donate to the Catalog Auction may also consign or donate to the Box Lot Auction. The complete *Catalog Auction Guidelines and Conditions* are outlined on pages 10 and 11.

All auction consignments will be included in the auction catalog available on WICA's website, www.whiteironstonechina.com, two weeks prior to the convention as well as in booklet form at the convention. During the Catalog Auction Preview remember:

- Catalog descriptions were provided by the consignors and donors.
- During auction check-in items were NOT vetted against the catalog description for additional damage or restorations.
- ❖ The auctioneer will NOT identify damage.
- ❖ Items may NOT be returned once sold.

BOX LOT AUCTION GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS

Purpose. The WICA Box Lot Auction provides WICA members an opportunity to either consign or donate white ironstone without the requirements associated with the Catalog Auction.

- No photos, descriptions, condition reports or auction consignment/donation forms are required.
- ➤ Items which are more common and those which may not be suitable for the Catalog Auction qualify for the Box Lot Auction.
- Researching to identify items is unnecessary.
- The final decision regarding items to be included in a box lot can be made when packing for the convention.

Consignors/Donors. All WICA members are encouraged to consign and/or donate to the WICA Box Lot Auction one or more box lots each consisting of one or more white ironstone items with the understanding that a box lot must fit comfortably (no overflow) into a 15" x 12" x 1 3/4" corrugated cardboard tray provided by WICA. There will not be a restriction on the opening bid for any box lot. If a member cannot attend the convention, he/she may consign and/or donate box lots as long as arrangements are made with someone who is registered for the convention to deliver and check in the consigned and/or donated box lot(s).

Method of Consignment/Donation. Consignors and donors are to indicate on the Convention Registration Form the number of 15" x 12" \times 1 3 4" corrugated cardboard trays required. Consignors will remit a \$5 non-refundable fee for each tray. Donors will not pay a fee.

Box Lot Description. No description, photo, or condition report is required although a consignor or donor may choose to do so if desired.

Consignment Fee Structure.

- WICA will not retain a consignment fee for box lots which sell for \$50 or less.
- For box lots which sell for more than \$50, WICA will retain a consignment fee of 10% for any amount over \$50.
- ➤ Lots will be sold to the highest bidder at the auction.
- > Consignors will be paid within four weeks from the date of the auction.

Donations. WICA will retain 100% of the selling price for all donated items.

Tax Deductibility. WICA is a public charity qualified under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Donations to WICA are tax deductible to the extent permitted by law. WICA cannot provide tax advice. Consult your tax advisor with respect to the availability and amount of any deduction that may be permitted in connection with your donation or consignment of lots for this auction. Consignors and donors will receive a receipt from WICA acknowledging the lots consigned or donated but without estimating their value.

Reserve Selling Price Option. Unlike the Catalog Auction, the Box Lot Auction does not offer a reserve selling price option.

Acceptance of Lots and Lot Limitations.

The total number of box lots to be accepted for May 4, 2024, is limited to 100, with a maximum of ten box lots for any one consignor or donor. Box lots should not contain salt-glaze, porcelain, or items of a similar appearance. Ironstone in a color other than white (light blue, for example) will not be accepted. A consignor/donor must authenticate as white ironstone any item which is questionable. During auction check-in any consignor or donor who presents a box lot containing one or more items which are not white ironstone will be given the opportunity to either remove the item(s) from the lot or remove the entire box lot from the auction; the \$5 box lot fee will not be refunded.

Late Consignments/Donations. A consignor or donor who would like to reserve one or more box lot trays after submitting the Convention Registration Form, should contact wica@whiteironstonechina.com by April 1, 2024, to determine box lot tray availability and make arrangements for payment of the \$5 fee for each tray.

Notification of Lot Acceptance. Prior to the convention, each consignor/donor will receive an email notification of the assigned box lot numbers and auction check-in time for Saturday, May 4.

Auction Check-In. The consignor/donor will check-in and will be shown where to unpack and the tray location(s). Items in each tray will be reviewed to assure they are white ironstone.

CATALOG AUCTION GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS

Purpose. The WICA Catalog Auction provides WICA members an opportunity to consign or donate white ironstone items which are very desirable due to type, shape, or function as well as items which are in excellent condition, free of major damage or restoration.

Consignors/Donors. All WICA members are encouraged to consign and/or donate items to the WICA Catalog Auction. A member can consign some items and donate others. Members are encouraged to consign and/or donate lots consisting of one or more items with the understanding that there will not be a restriction on the opening bid. If a member cannot attend the convention, he/she may consign and/or donate lots as long as arrangements are made with someone who is registered for the convention to deliver and check in the consignments and/or donations.

Method of Consignment/Donation.Consignors and donors are to complete and submit the 2024 Auction Consignment/Donation Agreement. Each lot is to be identified in full as indicated on the form.

<u>Consignment Agreement.</u> As a courtesy to fellow WICA members, please identify major damage such as large chips or cracks, overall discoloration, restoration and repairs, and mismatched lids and bases.

Consignment Agreement and Photos. The consignor's or donor's signature on the 2024 WICA Auction Consignment/Donation Agreement, which must be submitted by March 1, 2024, constitutes a binding obligation to supply the lots listed.

Photos are extremely important to assure consignments and donations are accurately identified, and they are an effective way to advertise them in the Auction Catalog. <u>Photos should be taken on a black background</u>. While digital photos in at least a 200 dpi format are preferred, hard copy photos will be accepted.

Photos will be included in the Auction Catalog and will also be used to create a PowerPoint presentation that will be shown during the

auction. As each lot comes up for bid, its photo and lot number will be displayed. This will allow bidders to more easily identify each lot.

Digital photos and a scanned copy of the consignment agreement may be sent via e-mail to dschine@mac.com. A hard-copy form and hard-copy photos are to be sent via postal mail to Denise Schine, 184 High Street, Pittsfield, MA 01201. Remember: The due date for the form and photos is **March 1**, 2024.

Consignment Fee Structure. WICA will retain 10% of the selling price for all consigned lots. Lots which do not have a reserve shall be sold to the highest bidder at the auction. Consignors will be paid within four weeks from the date of the auction.

Donations. WICA will retain 100% of the selling price for all donated items.

Tax Deductibility. WICA is a public charity qualified under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Donations to WICA are tax deductible to the extent permitted by law. WICA cannot provide tax advice. Consult your tax advisor with respect to the availability and amount of any deduction that may be permitted in connection with your donation or consignment of lots for this auction. Consignors and donors will receive a receipt from WICA acknowledging the lots consigned or donated but without estimating their value.

Reserve Selling Price Option. The lowest reserve price a consignor may place on an item is \$100. Consignors pay a non-refundable fee of \$10 for each lot on which they place a reserve. A reserve should reflect a reasonable and attainable amount and not necessarily the retail value of the lot. The consignor should determine the least amount he/she would like to clear when establishing a reserve for a lot. Donated items are sold unreserved. The consignor will submit to WICA a signed copy of the Consignment/Donation Agreement and a check equal to the total of all reserve fees for consignments listed on the Agreement. Reserve selling price lots will not be accepted if the \$10 fee per item is not received with the signed

Agreement. Lots on reserve will not be identified as such in the auction catalog or by the auctioneer. They are to be sold to the highest bidder who submits a bid equal to or greater than the reserve. If the reserve selling price of the consigned lot is not met, the lot will be passed and returned to the consignment table to be picked up by the consignor at the end of the auction.
